High School vs. College

High School

- Teachers continuously remind you about assignments
- No course syllabus (generally)
- You are allowed to turn things in late
- Material from your textbook is taught in class
- Missing for illness/extracurricular activities are 'excused' and students are allowed to make up work

College

- It is your responsibility to keep up with deadlines
- Syllabus is VITAL
- Assignment due dates are final, format matters!
- You are expected to read and learn course materials and be prepared to use that knowledge
- Absences are not 'excused' necessarily. it is instructor's discretion

College Expectations

- You should be in class every day
- You should check Canvas and Office365 every weekday
- Only excuse instructors MAY accept is...
 - A death in the immediate family
 - A medical emergency
- If you need accommodations to be successful, you must apply for them. There is no such thing as retroactive accommodations.

In high school, learning is <u>instructor</u>-led. In college, learning is <u>student</u>-led.




ADVICE FROM THE PROFESSIONALS

You will struggle, but that is normal. You've got this!




